

Tenpin Bowling

At the Tenpin Melbourne Cup Andrew McArthur from Alice Springs was runner up in the tournament to Jason Belmonte from NSW. Andrew was in 4th place after making the top 30 then moved into second with the help of a top score of 299/300 pins and a match average of 233.26 pins a game. Rebecca Simpson was trying to repeat her 2004 win by placing in the qualifying round in 3rd place but finished in 5th spot in the women's matchplay. Angela Shima finished in 29th place. Bruno Maglieri made the top 30 in 24th place but failed to make the next top 15 coming in 18th place.

Triathlon

Alison Fitch came 6th in the Switzerland 70.3 Ironman at RapperswilJona, she was the best Australian in the race. Water temperature was a chilly 14 degrees Celsius. Her time of 4 hours 15 minutes and 33 seconds was 17 minutes behind the leader in the professional female field. It was a 1.9km swim followed by a 90km bike leg then a 21.2km run leg.

In the Switzerland Ironman in Zurich, in the womens' race Alison Fitch came 3rd in the womens professional category. The lead changed more than once during the bike leg and the race had developed into a bun fight between Aussie Rebecca Preston, Swiss Sybille Matter and NTIS Ali Fitch all within minutes during the bike leg . At transition Preston held a 4 min lead over Matter and then another 40 secs back to Fitch. Once the run started Preston pressed her run strength but at one stage was passed by a flying Matter only to have Preston run over the top of her again to finish in 9:20 with Matter 6mins back in 9:26 and then Fitch into 3rd 4mins further back and a 15min pb finish in 9:31.
